Topics

1. Welcome

Commission chair Dušan Petrovič welcomed all participants and briefly discussed the purpose and main activities of the commission, which all can be found at the commission's website, edited by Klemen Kozmus Trajkovski, from the University of Ljubljana. Mr. Petrovič noted that the CMC member list found on the website requires revisions due to new EU regulations.

2. Minutes of previous meeting in Washington DC

The approved minutes of the previous meeting in Washington DC are available on the commission's website.

3. Report on activities in 2017 and 2018

At the ICC 2017 in Washington DC, our commission was one of the most active; there were five separate Mountain Cartography sessions, including one devoted to orienteering maps. The Mountain Cartography Commission was introduced at the opening ceremony, Commission's vice-chair Tom Patterson was the first keynote speaker, and the Commission's sustainable goal poster on climate change was displayed in the lobby.

As the next step of sustainable goal poster a commission's contribution to ICA sustainable goals book was prepared, mostly by Maša Arnež and Tom Patterson.

4. Workshop 2018 Hvar

Young scientist awards were given to four young scientists who presented their work at the workshop: Maša Arnež (Slovenia), Lukas Neugebauer and Benedikt Hajek (Austria), and Tomislav Jogun (Croatia).

The workshop program is accessible on the commission homepage at www.mountaincartography.org. Online posting of the presentations will follow in June; participants were asked to submit their corrected presentations or request not to be published.

The proceedings of the 11th Mountain Cartography Workshop in Hvar will be available at the beginning of the next year at the latest. The submission deadline for the proceedings and also for the journal Cartography and Geoinformation is the end of June 2018.

5. ICC 2019 Tokyo

No information or call for participation from ICC 2019 Scientific Program Committee has been received so far, but we expect to hear from them soon. All CMC members are encouraged to participate and submit abstracts on the topic of mountain cartography.

There will be General assembly at ICC 2019 Tokyo. For this event, the Commission needs to prepare a regular report, propose Terms of reference, and nominate a Chair and Co-chair for the next four-year period. Commission members support the current Chair and Co-chair to run for a next period.

6. Possible future workshops

Tom Patterson and Alex Tait presented a possible venue for the next workshop in 2020 in the White Mountains, New Hampshire, USA. The preferred time for the workshop is late spring. Other places in western USA will also be considered. The final decision about the location and the date will be discussed and decided at meeting during ICC Tokyo 2019.

Some ideas about possible locations for the 2022 workshop are Norway (Roger Wheate, Bjørn Sandvik) and Russia (Timofey Samsonov).

7. Members reports, possible other activities

Roger Smith announced the GeoCart'2018 cartographic conference in Wellington, New Zealand, September 5-7, 2018.
